The Director, SVCC delivered a lecture on Indian music and how music connects the hearts beyond the borders. A student of grade-IX Samadari Nitya of the school sang beautifully A R Rahman's 'Tu Hi Re' from 1995 Bollywood super hit film 'Bombay' during the programme which has been reached more than 80,000 in Facebook only in the last one month.
