

150-Bed Hospital at Dickoya



Scope of the Project:

Based on the request from the Government of Sri Lanka, Government of India constructed a 150-bed hospital at Dickoya to help the Plantation Community. Under the Project a full-fledged hospital with eight quarters for doctors was constructed and medical equipment, chemicals and furniture was also supplied for the hospital.

Project Cost: LKR 1.2 Billion (INR 48 Crore)

Modality of Implementation:

MoU was signed between the Government of Sri Lanka and Government of India on 16 April 2008 for construction of the hospital. The work commenced on 4th July 2011. After completion the hospital premises was handed over to the Government of Sri Lanka in July 2015. A few departments including OPD, Clinic and blood bank and hospital wards are already functioning. The procurement of medical equipment for the hospital is under progress.



Beneficiaries: Patients from the Central Province

Impact: The Project will benefit the plantation community to get better medical care. It also generated 75,000 mandays of employment during the period of construction of the hospital.
