

A dependable partner in **DEVELOPMENT OF SRI LANKA:** Infrastructure, livelihood and beyond

India's development partnership with Sri Lanka is driven by the priorities of the Government of Sri Lanka and aspirations of its people. At a total quantum of more than USD 4 billion, India has carried out development projects that covers large scale infrastructure and connectivity projects and human-centric projects ranging from health, education, housing, industrial development etc among others. Implementation of these projects contribute vastly to the local economy as they rely mostly on Sri Lankan contractors and labour for execution.

The ongoing five concessional lines of credit cut across areas such as defence, railways, transport, infrastructure development, connectivity, solar etc. Overcoming the challenges posed by the COVID19 pandemic, these projects have achieved considerable progress in the recent past.



Signing of the USD 100 million agreement between Government of Sri Lanka and EXIM Bank of India for solar energy projects in June 2021 underlines the commitment of the two Governments to clean and green energy and also aligns well with the vision of President of Sri Lanka to ensure that 70% of the country's energy requirements are met through renewable energy sources by 2030. The agreement would pave way for financing various projects including rooftop solar photo-voltaic systems for households and government buildings and a floating solar plant for the Parliament building of Sri Lanka.



Train service between Mount Lavinia and Kankesanthurai was launched earlier this month. 2021 witnessed the supply of 120 passenger coaches and 2 fully AC Diesel Multiple Units (DMUs) by RITES India Limited. Supply of 750 jeeps for Sri Lanka Police (including 150 jeeps for the Police Special Task Force) and 500 buses for the Sri Lanka Transport Board from India has also been approved.







Phase -III of the Indian Housing Project in plantation areas of Sri Lanka is nearing completion. While 1235 houses were handed over during the visit of Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla in October 2021, over a thousand houses were handed over on the auspicious occasion of Pongal in January 2022. Total of around 50,000 houses have been built across Sri Lanka under this flagship scheme so far. In the next phase, another 10000 houses shall be constructed in the plantation areas.

Testifying to the breadth of India's development partnership with Sri Lanka, Foreign Secretary also inaugurated a Model Housing Village in Vavuniya, a renovated Vada Ladies Central College in Vadamarachi and a multi-purpose hall in Saraswathy Central College in Pussellawa, all of which were implemented through grant assistance by Government of India.

1990 Suwaseriya emergency ambulance has proved to be of great value during the testing pandemic times. Rabindranath Tagore auditorium in Ruhuna University is a state-of-the-art structure and among the largest such facilities in the Southern Province.

The 5000 MT temperature-controlled warehouse in Dambulla, the first of its kind in the country, is expected to be complete soon. This could immensely aid the farming community in Dambulla area and neighbouring Districts by extending the shelf life of their produce. In a unique arrangement, an Indian and Sri Lanka entity joined hands and formed a Joint Venture solely towards the realization of the project.



Two Integrated water supply projects in Polgahawela and Aluthgama with a support of US\$ 91.80 million and US\$ 164.90 million respectively are almost 90% complete. They are expected to be commissioned soon. These projects will touch the lives of more than 750,000 people and fulfill their dream of getting safe and clean tap water.

India is associated with more than 80 people-driven grant projects encompassing diverse areas in all parts of Sri Lanka.

















Multi-faceted nature of defence cooperation between India and Sri Lanka encompasses myriad activities in numerous domains including training, joint exercises, supply of military equipment etc. They are also marked by institutional dialogues at different levels and periodic bilateral goodwill visits by Navy and Coast Guard ships. Sri Lanka has been accorded the status of 'Priority One' partner by India.

Attesting to the deep nature of this engagement, Colombo Security Conclave Secretariat was inaugurated in March 2021 and the consequent Deputy NSA meeting was held in Sri Lanka on 4 August 2021 in order to work towards actionable engagements in tackling common security challenges.

Chief of Army Staff of the Indian Army visited Sri Lanka in October 2021 during which he called on the Sri Lankan political and military leadership. He was the Chief Guest at the Gajaba Day celebrations. He gifted two simulators along with training aids and cut models to facilitate quality training imparted by Sri Lanka Army and also provided one upgrade kit for the L-70 anti-Aircraft gun to Sri Lanka Air Force to ensure full automation of the gun.

Armies of the two countries conducted Ex Mitra Shakti, which is Sri Lanka's biggest military bilateral engagement. This year saw a monumental enhancement in the exercise from an Infantry Company level to a Combined Arms concept.

Multi-faceted nature of this partnership and India's commitment towards its 'Neighbourhood First' policy was manifested when Indian Naval Ship Shakthi was deployed for delivering 100 tonnes of medical grade oxygen to Sri Lanka during early phases of the third COVID-19 wave in August 2021. Two Indian Air Force C-17 aircrafts were deployed for supplying 100 tonnes of nano fertilizers in November 2021.

Training is a significant and enduring pillar of bilateral defence cooperation between the two countries with India being the largest provider of foreign training assistance to Sri Lankan Armed Forces. This continued despite Covid-19 restrictions and in fact, the courses in India witnessed an increased participation from Sri Lanka in premier defence institutes.

The 1st Training Squadron comprising six ships from Indian Navy and Indian Coast Guard visited Sri Lanka from 24-28 October 2021. The visit broadened the horizon of young naval officers about the rich cultural heritage, traditions and social structure of a different country.

The old bonds of defence training establishments was institutionalized with the inauguration of National Defence College (NDC) India Alumni Association in Sri Lanka on 21 October 2021.























Inaugural International Flight to Kushinggar





A delegation from Sri Lanka, led by Hon'ble Namal Rajapaksa, Minister of Youth and Sports, Minister of Development Co-ordination and Monitoring and State Minister of Digital Technology and Enterprise Development, and consisting of around 100 senior Buddhist monks belonging to different sects and prominent temples spread across Sri Lanka besides 4 State Ministers and other officials took the inaugural international flight to Kushinagar from Colombo on auspicious Vap Poya Day on 20 October 2021.

Kushinagar has a pre-eminent position given that The Buddha attained Mahaparinirvana here. Kushinagar is considered to be a focal point of the Buddhist Circuit in India and the new international airport, which was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, is likely to strengthen people to people interactions between India and Sri Lanka substantially.

In addition to paying their respects at Parinirvan Stupa and Ramabhar Stupa in Kushinagar, the delegation sought blessings of The Buddha at Mulagandha Kutti Vihara in Saranath and undertook a boat ride in the holy river Ganga during which they also saw the famous 'Ghats' of Varanasi.

The sacred Kapilavastu Buddha relics from the Rajaguru Sri Subhuthi Maha Vihara of Waskaduwa were also ceremoniously brought on board the first international flight to Kushinagar by Most Ven. Waskaduwe Mahindawamsa Nayaka Thero, Chief Incumbent of the Rajaguru Sri Subhuthi Maha Vihara.



Since its inception in 1998 as an inter-governmental initiative, the India – Sri Lanka Foundation (ISLF) has been continuously fostering ties between the two countries through economic, education, scientific, technical and cultural cooperation. As a result, the ISLF has been instrumental in establishing greater people to people contacts. The specific focus of the ISLF pivots around supporting creative initiatives and bringing together the youth and the civil societies of the two countries. Till date, the Foundation has funded more than 300 projects worth SLR.150 million and currently 20 projects in the areas of research, art & culture, social work, science and technology etc. are in progress. The ISLF has supported youth exchange programmes and has also promoted the pursuit of higher studies as well as research, besides supporting a variety of cultural programmes.

Recently, ISLF has provided a financial assistance of SLR.500,000 to Sri Palee Campus of University of Colombo for setting up the "Guru Dev Rabindranath Tagore Gold Medal" for the best student as well as extended assistance of SLR.500,000/- to the Sinidu Foundation in support of their efforts to meet sanitary needs of underprivileged women in Sri Lanka. ISLF has also funded many social events including the Attorney General's Department, the Legal Officers' Association to organize a fundraiser, "A Ray of Hope" to help the children who lost their parents in the Easter Sunday Bomb attack (2019); donation of 300 white canes, scholarships for 50 students and 100 radios to visually impaired citizens through Welfare Organization of Visually Impaired Women (2019). ISLF will continue to collaborate further for strengthening people to people linkages between both the countries.





Equipping for the future: ITEC

EC

The Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) Programme was instituted by Government of India in 1964 as an assistance programme. This fully funded Programme, covering airfare, accommodation, study tours, course fee and other allowances, has grown considerably over the years and along with its sister program SCAAP (Special Commonwealth African Assistance Programme), 161 countries across the globe are invited to gain from sharing of the Indian developmental experience. Under capacity building, which is an important pillar of ITEC, professionals from these countries are offered tailor-made training courses in both civilian and defence spheres across 24 different streams in reputed institutions in India.

Sri Lanka is among the most important ITEC partner countries and 402 fully-funded slots are offered every year to Sri Lankan Government personnel and other nationals for short-term training programs towards enhancing their skill-set. The courses are spread over a multitude of sectors such as Management & Leadership, International Trade, Tourism, Textiles, Renewable Energy, Petroleum & Hydrocarbon, IT, English language etc. The Programme draws an enthusiastic response in Sri Lanka every year.

The Programme has been modified into e-ITEC due to restrictions on account of Covid. Since then, more than 550 participants from Sri Lanka attended various e-ITEC Programmes in diverse areas. Some of the latest modules extended to Sri Lanka dealt with Petroleum, traditional medicine, law and order etc.
