

Construction of 3400 Sanitation Units/Toilets to enhance the Public health in Batticaloa District of Sri Lanka



Scope of the Project: Considering the need for assistance to improve the living condition of the destitutes in Batticaloa District of Sri Lanka, Government of India has agreed to the request of Sri Lanka Government for construction of 3400 sanitation units/toilets in Batticaloa. The project will help economically deprived people, who are at risk of diseases due to poor sanitation facilities.

Project Cost : 300 million SLR

Project Duration : 2018-19

Implementing Partners:

(a) Ministry of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources Development and Rural Economy, GoSL,

(b) Department of Project Management and Monitoring, and

(c) Department of External Resources



Modalities of Implementation : The project is being implemented under the Small Development Project (SDP) model. A Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between the Government of the Republic of India and the Government of the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka has been signed on 19 July, 2018 in the presence of Mr. M.S.S. Ameer Ali, Hon'ble Deputy Minister of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources



Development and Rural Economy. To monitor the implementation of the project, a Project Steering Committee (PSC) has been constituted. It is co-chaired by Deputy High Commissioner of India and Secretary, Ministry of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources Development and Rural Economy. It also includes representatives of the Project Consultant, Department of Project Management & Monitoring

and Department of External Resources, Ministry of National Policies and Economic Affairs, GoSL. Technical Evaluation Committee of the Project will comprise of the members from High Commission of India and from Govt. of Sri Lanka, as nominated by Secretary, Ministry of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources Development and Rural Economy.

Beneficiaries: The project will benefit 3400 families, with access to regular and safe sanitation units, attached to their respective home.
