

# Supply of Agricultural Implements



## Scope of the Project:

Immediately after the end of the civil war in May 2009, Government of India approved a Project to supply basic agricultural tools to revive farming in the Northern Province which happens to be the primary occupation of the people.

**Project Cost:** SLR 224 million (INR 14 Crore)



**Duration:** Project completed (Project Duration: 24 months, 2009-11)

## Implementing Partners:

1. Ministry of Resettlement and Disaster Relief service.
2. Office of the Commissioner General of Essential services.
3. Sri Lanka State Trading Corporation (supplier)

## Modality of implementation:

Government of India supplied 95,000 agricultural packs to farmers through the Government Agents of Vavuniya, Killinochi, Mullaitheevu, Jaffna, and Mannar districts under the overall supervision of the Ministry of Re-Settlement. Each pack consisted of agricultural tools like Mamoty (Pickaxe) with wooden handle, Mamoty Fork with wooden handle, Knife sets etc.



**Beneficiaries:** 95,000 farming families displaced during the war

**Impact:** The Project has helped about 95,000 farming families to assist in the revival of agricultural activities in their farm land. The Project has helped the internally displaced people who were dependent on agriculture to earn a livelihood
