## **3 & 4 April** A Creative Writing Workshop – AUTHORED BY

On 03 & 04 of April a creative writing workshop "Authored by" was held at the Indian Cultural Centre and the book launch at Barefoot Gallery. **Authored By** is a cross cultural literary initiative by Aparna Raman, Founder of Timbuktoo Young Authors Publishing and ArtikaBakshi of the Good Book Corner. ## 9 April Film Screening: Abhaas, Directed by Ms. Bijaya Jena

Indian Cultural Centre screened the film titled **Abhaas** directed by BijayaJenaat 11 am on 9 April 2015 at its auditorium.

Abhaas is Bijaya's second feature film (in the Hindi language), which she scripted, directed and produced and played an important role in it. The film was made in 1996. Ms Jena's film 'Abhaas' is a poetic parable and a realist drama on the pastoral paradise that is rural India ,set in a small village in the lush green fields of Orissa it is both a sweeping cross generational tale of an aristocratic family and the peasants who form the two aspects of this fragile social milieu ,but moreover it is a sensitive human drama that discusses some forbidden themes which border onto almost incest ,adultery and lost youth love and aborted lives in a very spontaneous subtle manner where the characters are given full freedom to exploit the best and the worst in the human spiritual aptitude . Around 45 guests attended the screening.
