
16 January Special screening of the feature film "Sri Siddhartha Gautama"

Gunasena is a senior member of both the Sinhalese and Tamil Orchestras for the Sri Lanka Broadcasting Corporation.

The renowned spiritual vocalist Sonam Kalra and her Sufi Gospel Project from India mesmerized the fully packed audience at the Bishop's College Auditorium with their mellifluent virtuosity in their songs that sung. Her performance in Colombo was part of the 64th Anniversary of the Republic Day of India. Rauff Hakeem, Minister of Justice was the Chief Guest on the occasion and Y. K. Sinha, High Commissioner of India, presided over the function. Several Ambassadors and cultural personalities attended the event.

Known for her powerful yet sensitive voice and her ability to blend styles, Sonam Kalra and her troupe justified their talents with their brilliant performance. Assimilating the nuances of spirituality of the Persian, Western and great Indian traditions were the core features of her compositions. One could hear the blending of Christian hymns with that of Kabir verses and the trance-effects of the Sufi ways of singing along with the Hindustani style to which she often resorted to.

Though born as a Sikh, Sonam, with her innovative ideals of singing and devotion to the absolute, came up with a style of singing that underlines that the path towards God, whatever may be the route one takes reaches, is that of faith and of universal truth.


