Students and music lovers organized an event to felicitate Dr. KalasuriArunthathy Sri Renganathan, eminent musicologist carnatic vocalist of Sri Lanka for her contribution in the field of music. Several eminent scholars spoke on the various contribution of Dr. Arunthathy.

Kalasuri Desha NethruArunthathy Sri Ranganathan is one of the pioneers in the field of Broadcasting in Sri Lanka. She commenced her longstanding career at Sri Lankan Broadcasting Corporation in the SLBC's Tamil Service as Program Producer in 1974. She climbed the career ladder in the field of Broadcasting by sheer dint of perseverance and hard work. At SLBC, she became Program Controller in 1979, then Director (Music) in 1984 and finally, she served as the Director (Tamil Service) in 1994. Arunthathy Sri Renganathan excelled at SLBC leaving a rich legacy for posterity. Her major interests are arts, culture and broadcasting. She is a pioneer in broadcasting who served the nation for over 30 fruitful years.

She is one of Sri Lanka's best known cultural ambassadors who forged an important cultural links among diplomatic community in Sri Lanka and represented Sri Lanka at diverse international cultural festivals.






#### 7 April World Health Day – 1<sup>st</sup> Curtain Raiser event - IDY 2019


